--->> these are hair like, helical appendages that protrude through the cell wall, 0.01  $\hat{a} \in 0.02 \hat{A} \mu m$  in diameter and simple in structure. Based on their location on the cell, they may be polar or lateral.

these are helical bacteria, small, regularly coiled, rigid, organisms measuring 3-4 $\hat{A}\mu m$  in length. Each coil measures about  $1\hat{A}\mu m$ , e.g. Spirillum minus.

uncommon parts of bacterium cell with no clearly defined structure external to the cell wall.
